Accreditation Fees

Fees for recovery residence providers are based in part on residential capacity. WAQRR established this fee schedule to ensure an equitable distribution of financial support across operators of different sizes and types. This table will help you calculate the accreditation fee for your organization based on your capacity. Enter the total resident capacity over 10 for each residence in column D. The total fee is the sum of the \$50 non-refundable application fee, the \$200 certification fee (refundable if you're not certified), \$50 per residence inspection fee (including return inspections) and the capacity-based charge for residents in each residence over 10.

Membership

Associate Fee

Associates are people or organizations who are not residence operators but who support the work of WAQRR. Associates pay only the \$50 associate fee on an annual basis.
